



SEMI- ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE FTSE4GOOD INDICES

SEPTEMBER 2008

This paper provides the details of the September 2008 FTSE4Good Semi-Annual index review. The FTSE4Good Policy Committee has approved all constituent changes.

1. INCLUSIONS

A total of 36 companies are new entrants to the FTSE4Good Index Series. The table below shows the nationality of these companies (see Appendix 1 for names and sectors).
