## FTSE BURSA MALAYSIA EMAS SHARIAH INDEX SCREENING METHODOLOGY

The FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Shariah Index applies the principles set out by the SAC in the design of this index.

The general criteria stipulate that Shariah compliant companies must not be involved in any of the following core activities:

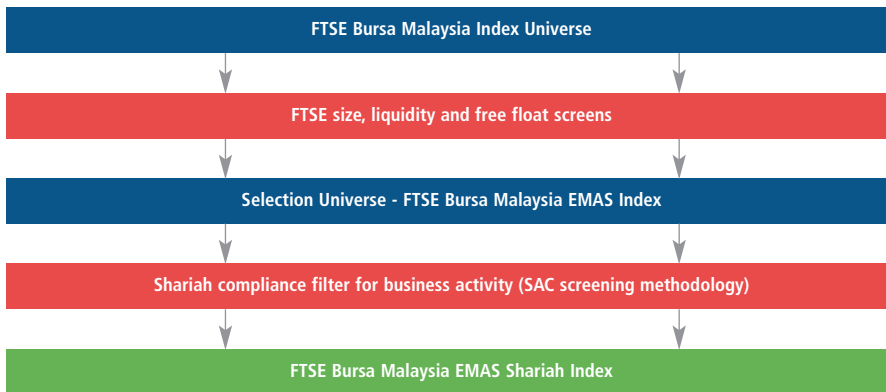
- Financial services based on riba (interest)
- Gambling
- Manufacture or sale of non-halal products or related products
- Conventional insurance
- Entertainment activities that are non-permissible according to Shariah
- Manufacture or sale of tobacco based products or related products
- Stockbroking or share trading in Shariah non-compliant securities
- Other activities deemed non-permissible according to Shariah

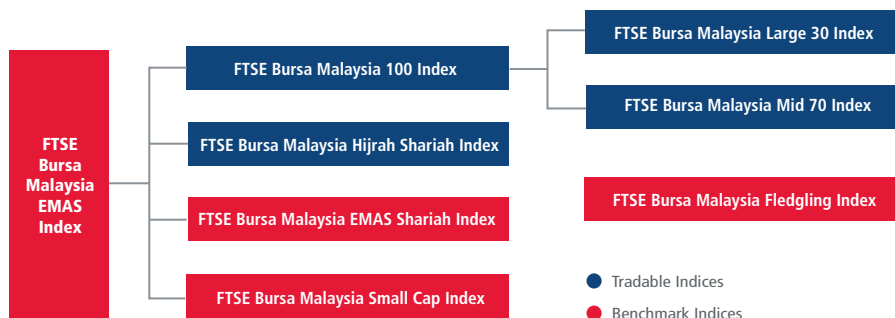
## FEATURES

- The index comprises the constituents of the FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS index that are Shariah-compliant according to the Securities Commission’s Shariah Advisory Council (SAC) screening methodology. The FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS index incorporates the large and mid cap stocks of the FTSE Bursa Malaysia 100 Index, and the FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Cap Index
- The index is part of the FTSE Bursa Malaysia index series which includes the FTSE Bursa Malaysia Large 30, FTSE Bursa Malaysia Mid 70, FTSE Bursa Malaysia 100, FTSE Bursa Malaysia Small Cap, FTSE Bursa Malaysia EMAS Shariah, FTSE Bursa Malaysia Fledgling and FTSE Bursa Malaysia Hijrah Shariah Indices
- The FTSE Bursa Malaysia Hijrah Shariah Index is the second index for Shariah investors in the Bursa Malaysia series. This is a tradable index screened for international Shariah requirements
- The indices are designed for the creation of derivatives, index tracking funds, ETFs and performance benchmarks
- Stocks are free-float weighted to ensure that only the investable opportunity set is included within the indices
- Stocks are liquidity screened to ensure that the index is tradable
- Capital and total return indices are available within this series
