On 16 May two additional indices were added to the FTSE AIM Index series – these are

1. the FTSE AIM UK 50 comprising the 50 largest (by market capitalization on 31 March) eligible UK domiciled stocks quoted on AIM
 2. the FTSE AIM 100 consisting of the 100 largest (by market capitalization on 31 March) eligible UK and International, stocks quoted on AIM.
- On the same day, the FTSE AIM Index was renamed the FTSE AIM All-Share Index and adopted a new methodology to include free float and liquidity rules.
3. the FTSE AIM All-Share then consisted of all the constituents of the existing AIM index, except those with a free float less than 15% or insufficient liquidity and this involved 381 deletions (371 for liquidity failings and 10 for having less than the required 15% free float).

The initial constituents of the FTSE UK AIM 50 Index are set out in Table S. The initial constituents of the FTSE AIM 100 Index, were all those in Table T plus all those in Table U. The 381 resulting deletions were added to the existing Table Q. The new indices are subject to quarterly reviews, the later changes being listed in Tables P(ii), Q(ii), T & U.

Users of these Notes may care to observe that the corresponding Notes for 2006 will be restricted to changes in the fully-quoted constituents of the FTSE Actuaries Share Indices, to which will be added those of the Fledgling Index. Anyone interested in continued listings of AIM changes should ring, or e-mail, the Client Services Department as indicated on p.36.

At the end of 2005, the existing Global Classification System was replaced by the Industry Classification Benchmark.

FTSE International then adopted the new Industry Classification Benchmark throughout its indices. The Industrial Classification Benchmark had been developed in conjunction with Dow Jones Indexes during 2004, with a view to its becoming a universally accepted system.

Consequently, all FTSE's existing indices, including the FTSE Actuaries All-Share Indices, which had previously been using the FTSE Global Classification System, adopted the FTSE Industrial Classification Benchmark from January 2006. The most noticeable changes were the introduction of 18 Supersectors - in addition to the Sectors and Subsectors (of which there are a similar number to those in the Global Classification System – of which some 70% are unchanged), and also the top level 'Economic Groups' have become 'Industries'. Perhaps the most significant change is the removal of the Cyclical / Non-Cyclical Economic Groups distinction, which had been introduced when the Global Classification System was itself adopted.

It was found that less than 10% of the FTSE Actuaries All-Share constituents have moved to different Sectors – provided the occasional renaming of continuing Sectors is ignored. It should be remembered that the published indices are classified by Sector, not by Subsector, so that any change of Subsector, within the same Sector, does not involve index reclassification. Table E in the 2006 Note in this series lists the 56 constituents so effected.
